






QT Information Systems

Today's GFS modeling has additional Corn Belt storms during the next <u>7-10 days</u> with some of the least falling in SE NE and C IA (?).




QT Weather Map Alerts




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Corn Belt (and Plains) temperatures will continue to "co-operate" with no sustained stressing heat into mid-August.



The week ahead will see a "summer" storm and associated fronts (anything but the doldrums) cross the Plains and Corn Belt. S IA is likely to "miss out".
