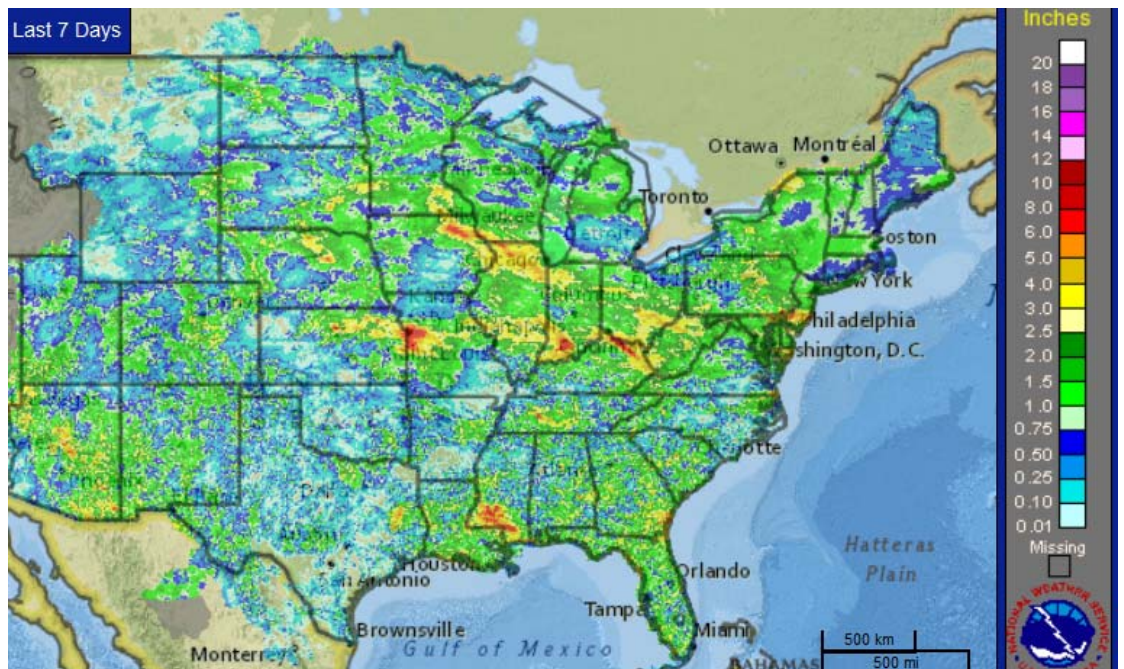

Rains during the past 7 days crossed every state of the nation. Some of the heaviest fell in AZ, SD, NE, KS, MN, IA, MO, IL, IN, OH, KY, TN, MS and NJ. Some of the least fell in MT, OK, TX, AR, NC, MA and ME.

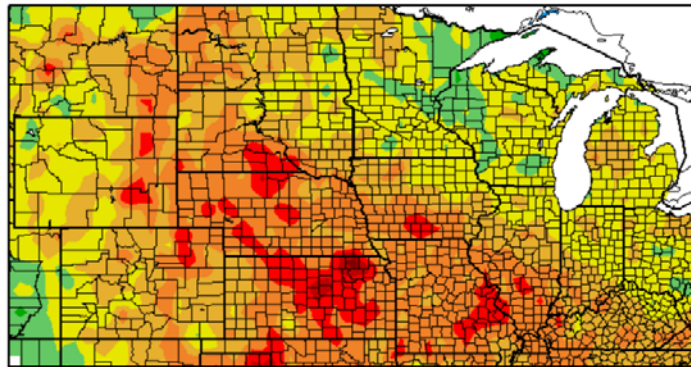

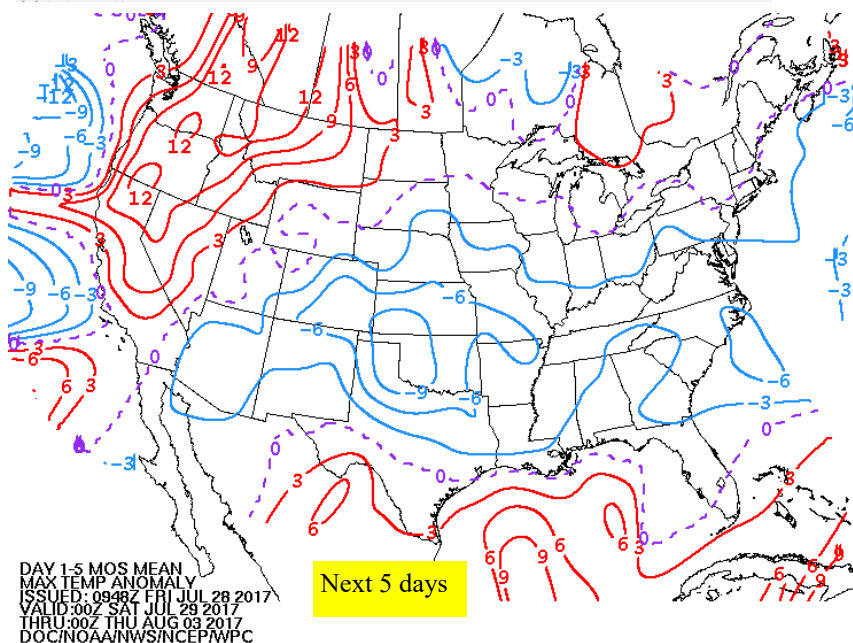
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Departure from Normal Temperature (F)
7/20/2017 - 7/26/2017

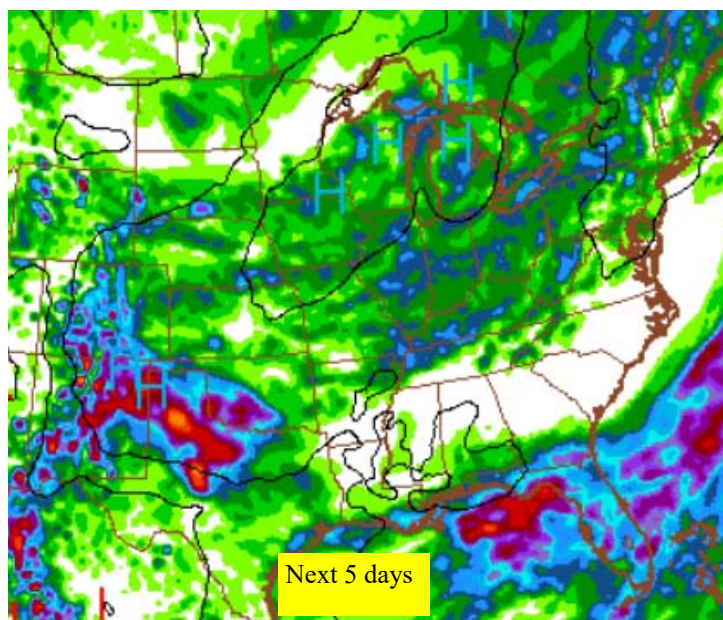


The past 7 days saw every Corn Belt and Plains state average warmer than normal with portions of ND, MN, IA, WI, MI, IL, IN and OH closer to the norm or cooler than (greens).

All Plains, South Corn Belt and East states will average below normal temperatures during the next 5 days, except ND will be close to normal (west 1/4 above).



The middle of next week will see a cold front drop from the Can. Prairie into the W and C Corn Belt with rains focusing back in the far S Plains too.
